Goal: take away one new thing



History

- 2017:
 - Data Integration Specialist position created at CEPI liaison between CEPI and MiDataHub
- 2018:
 - UIC services implemented:
 - January: MiSTAR-Q
 - June: Skyward
 - August: Powerschool
 - EEM Integration completed
- 2019:
 - UIC services implemented by Infinite Campus
 - "Enhanced" UIC services released
 - Student Snack-Pack v1 released (November)
 - Implemented by MiSTAR-Q



History (continued)

- 2020:
 - Snack-Pack implemented: Powerschool, Skyward
- 2021:
 - Snack-Pack implemented: Infinite Campus, Synergy
 - Snack-Pack v2 released implemented with MiSTAR-Q
 - Direct Cert integration released implemented with MiSTAR-Q
 - First MSDS collection submitted via MiDH cockpit (Skyward Qmlativ)
- 2022:
 - Snack-Pack v2 implemented by remaining SIS vendors
- 2023:
 - UIC Services implemented by Synergy




- What is it?
 - Search/create UICs from your local SIS
 - No need to log in to MSDS
- What are the benefits?
 - UIC retrieved/created as early as student enrollment
 - Process takes seconds (instead of minutes if done in MSDS)



How does it work?

- SIS sends student core data and whether or not to autocreate a UIC if none found (permission-based)
- 2. Identity API formats the request and sends to plug-in
- 3. Request for UIC plug-in calls the appropriate service to send to CEPI
- CEPI UIC Service returns an exact match, potential matches, or a new UIC (if auto-create parameter exists)
- 5. Identities API returns the results to the SIS





- Available functionality
 - Individual search requests
 - Bulk search requests
 - Resolve potential matches
 - Extended collection information (R/E, Grade, Enroll/Exit Date, Exit Status, Address, District)
 - Send requests for new UICs (reviewed by CEPI)
 - UIC Linking requests
 - Fields added to Identities API since initial release
 - Local Student ID
 - Match Status (Match Found, New UIC, Requires Resolution, etc)



Portable Student Records

What problem are we trying to solve?

- Students are highly mobile*
 - Statewide mobility rate in 2023-24: 6% (82,000 students)
- Information from previous district isn't timely
 - 30- to 60-day delay on average
 - Parents may not know what services the student had
 - MSDS has limitations


Many students do not receive services they are entitled to, in a timely manner

The solution!


- Snack-Pack

In partnership with the Michigan Data Hub



Contains critical information necessary at the time of student enrollment. Examples:



- Services that must legally start within a specific timeframe (30 days for IEPs)
- Special Education
- English Learners
- Homeless
- Foster Care
- Program Eligibility/Participation



- 1. A district "opts-in" to Snack-Pack in the MiDataHub cockpit
- 2. An enrolling district obtains a student's UIC via the Identities API.
- 3. The district can then request the Snack-Pack via MiDataHub.
- 4. The Snack-Pack is returned to the district via MiDataHub.





- Implemented: November 2019
- Works with all 5 "connected" SISs in Michigan:
- Usage:
 - 671 of 887 districts opted in (75%)
 - Additional 86 districts able to opt in (up to 85%)
 - ISDs with more than 5 districts not opted in:

Implementation Considerations

- Automatic retrieval of Snack-Pack upon UIC match (enrollment into SIS)
- On-screen display
- Store data for future retrieval
- Permissions
- Notifications
 - Application alerts, Email, Text
- Additional automation
 - Example: ED/CEP and Food Service system



Automated Processing

- Student was in previous district as CEP
- 10-day meal program account created





Automated Processing


- Several snack pack attributes are used to create records in campus tech center databases
- Ensure sending school data provided to students are known by CTE Staff.
- Automated fetch after each count submission to ensure snack pack is up to date for campus technical teachers with home school services





Automated Processing


- Based on Snack Pack Exit Code and Exit Date from previous district, expelled messaging displayed if enrollment is attempted
- Does not disallow enrollment, provides notification only








Combines the Snack-Pack data with a bit more longitudinal data such as a history of student demographics:



- Special Education
- English Learners
- Homelessness
- Foster Care
- Grade Retention
- Assessment Results

Portable Student Records – Lunchbox (TBD)











Combines the Snack-Pack and Lunchbox data into a complete, electronic student data record.



- Local District data not collected by CEPI / MDE
 - Transcript data
 - Local Assessments
 - Academic Intervention Plans

Portable Student Records – Backpack (TBD)







Direct Certification Integration

What is it?

- Search direct certification status from your local SIS
 - One or more students
- Get direct certification status for all students in the district
 - i.e. fetch the most recent direct certification report
- All activity occurs in SIS or Food Service System

What are the benefits?

- Get a student's DC status as early as student enrollment
- Individual lookup takes seconds (instead of minutes if done in MSDS)
- District lookup takes a couple minutes (compared to hours)
- No manual exporting/importing



- What fields are included?


 - School Facility Number
 - Local Student ID
 - Direct Cert Eligibility Category
 - Exit Date (if applicable)
 - Eligibility Date

 - Skyward report only
 - Infinite Campus considering implementing
 - Meal Magic help!

Implementation Considerations




- Automatic retrieval of DC status upon UIC match (enrollment into SIS) through connection to MI Data Hub
- Permissions
- Notifications
 - Application alerts, Email, Text
- Automate your direct cert import process
 - i.e. get the data right from MiDataHub instead of an import file



What is it?

- Submit MSDS data from MiDH cockpit instead of local SIS
- MiDH cockpit contains tools needed for errorchecking and verifying data accuracy

What are the benefits?

- Error-checking / verification can be done up front, instead of after uploading to MSDS
- Alerts can be set up to notify you of errors / warnings
- Reduction in file uploads to MSDS

State Reporting (MSDS)



- Available functionality
 - Alerts
 - Error-check
 - Includes 50+ CEPI Data Quality checks
 - System reports
 - Many are similar to CEPI staging reports
 - Collection Comparison tool
 - Helpful for onboarding and troubleshooting
 - Collection Extractor
 - Export and upload to MSDS

State Reporting (MSDS)




- 2024-25:
 - Skyward Qmlativ: 18 live districts
 - Other SIS vendors: multiple districts piloting
 - Weekly meetings
 - Basecamp group
